Footnotes:

- (1) Non-resident Graduate students enrolled in 6 hours or less pay resident rates in the first and second semesters only. All other non-resident Graduate students, including first and second semester students enrolled for 7 hours or more, pay non-resident rates for all hours taken. Non-resident, Non-Degree Graduate students pay non-resident rates for ALL credit hours taken.
- (2) Undergrad & Non-Degree Undergrad rates for students with no baccalaureate degree.
- (3) Grad & Non-Degree Grad rates for students with baccalaureate degree or higher.
- (4) All Grad (including Law), ASM-Grad, Pharm D, Dissertation, and Med students pay a \$25 GPSA fee per semester; Full-time students (12-18 hrs) receive a \$25 tuition discount.
- (5) All students enrolled in HSC programs will be charged a \$130 HSC Library Fee and a \$1 HSC Student Council Fee.
- (6) Students in the Physician Assistant program will be assessed a \$1,000 curriculum fee.
- (7) Law students will be assessed a \$250 curriculum fee.
- (8) New admits to the College of Education will be assessed a one-time \$125 curriculum fee (TK20).
- (9) Mandatory Disability Insurance of \$103.08 assessed (annual cost)
- (10) Mandatory Needlestick Insurance of \$30.00 assessed
- (11) Mandatory Curriculum Fee of \$1,350 assessed

Correspondence Courses

Regardless of residency status, students enrolling in Correspondence Courses will be charged at the **NM Resident Undergrad** rate listed above. Please note, however, that **(1) tuition for these courses is calculated separately and added to any Main or Branch Campus tuition, and (2) all hours are assessed at the per hour rate, meaning there is no full-time flat tuition.** In addition, these courses have their own refund deadlines as explained below.

Senior Citizens

A student qualifies for a reduced tuition rate of \$5.00/credit hour if they are:

- 1 - A New Mexico resident as defined by the NM Department of Higher Ed;
- 2 - Age 65 or older as of the 21st day from the start of the semester;
- 3 - Registering for no more than six (6) credit hours;
- 4 - Registering on or after January 14, 2013 for the Spring 2013 semester.

Open Learning Courses, or courses that are outside the traditional schedule, as listed in the *Schedule of Classes*, are fully refundable if dropped before 20% of the course has been completed, except for Correspondence Courses (see below). Do not include partial days when calculating 20% of completion. For example, 20% of 8-day course equals 1.6 days. Refund, therefore, is calculated only if dropped on or before the first day. **Courses with duration of 5 days or less must be dropped on or before the first day of the course to receive a full refund.**

Correspondence Courses are fully refundable if dropped on or before the 33rd day of registration **AND** no coursework has been submitted.

Students may not drop a course by simply not attending. They are responsible for officially dropping or withdrawing from the University by the published deadlines (see above) to insure proper credit of tuition and fees. A student's readmission, registration, library or parking privileges, release of official records, and other requests may be restricted or denied until all past due charges have been paid in full.
